The military has implemented policies and programs to discourage nicotine use. Despite these efforts, a greater than expected proportion of USAF trainees first initiate nicotine use while in technical school.

This study examined why USAF trainees initiate nicotine use in technical school, which was accomplished by collecting real-world, qualitative information from trainees about their subjective impressions.

Research is examining the multifinality of PTSD outcomes following intimate partner violence victimization. A theoretical model which examined the additive risk of associated with prior interpersonal trauma & maladaptive cognitive styles and utilized original data collection. Model was informed by extant literature and prominent PTSD models. Outcome yielded statistically significant support for the proposed model.
