Research is examining the multifinality of PTSD outcomes following intimate partner violence victimization. A theoretical model which examined the additive risk associated with prior interpersonal trauma and maladaptive cognitive styles and utilized original data collection. Model was informed by extant literature and prominent PTSD models. Outcome yielded statistically significant support for the proposed model.
